Missouri - latest jurisdiction to join the PTLC

In early July, Missouri became the fourth state to pass Physical Therapy Licensure Compact (PTLC) legislation. The PTLC language was first presented as a stand-alone bill sponsored by Rep. Charlie Davis, Vice-Chairman of the Veterans Committee. The PTLC language was not making progress as a stand-alone bill and the language was added as an amendment to other bills that were potentially viable vehicles. Ultimately, the PTLC passed as an amendment to HB 1816 which was signed into law by Governor Nixon. In additional to the PTLC, HB 1816 will allow Missouri regulatory boards, including the physical therapy board, to work with state agencies to collect workforce data.

Reading: 22Listening: 21Speaking: 24Writing: 22


• Total Minimum: 89

Rationale: The original TOEFL standard was last reviewed in 2004. It is common practice to revisit standards over time and in light of changes in the profession. The cut scores were based on the recommendation of the TOEFL Standard Setting Panel, impact data and input from the Foreign Educated Standards Committee.


